You're invited to celebrate the true meaning of Labor Day with Workers Interfaith Network (WIN) at the Faith and Labor Picnic. The picnic is the “ultimate party with a purpose” according to one of last year’s participants. It is also WIN’s annual fundraiser, making it possible for us to advocate for living wages and workers’

rights.

Your admission this year will be discounted 15% if you buy your tickets in advance, so don’t wait until Labor Day to get your tickets! Advance tickets are available at WorkersInterfaithNetwork.org, by calling (901) 332-3570, or by buying them from a volunteer. Advance tickets are \$10 for adults, \$5 for kids ages 5 – 12, or a maximum charge of \$30 per family. The day of the picnic, prices will be \$12 for adults, \$6 for kids, and \$35 for families.

Your ticket covers all food and beverages, live music and dance performances, a Moon Bounce and face painting for the kids, and the chance to win door prizes. Entertainment this year will be provided by John Kilzer, Danza Azteca, Alicia Washington, and Esteban Alexis. There’s plenty of shade, but you probably want to bring your own blanket or folding chair.

The Faith and Labor Picnic will be held on Labor Day, Monday, September 5th from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Trinity United Methodist Church in Midtown, 1738 Galloway Ave. near the Memphis Zoo.
